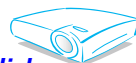

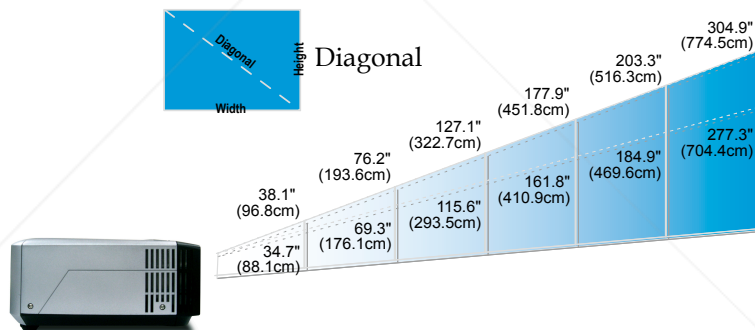

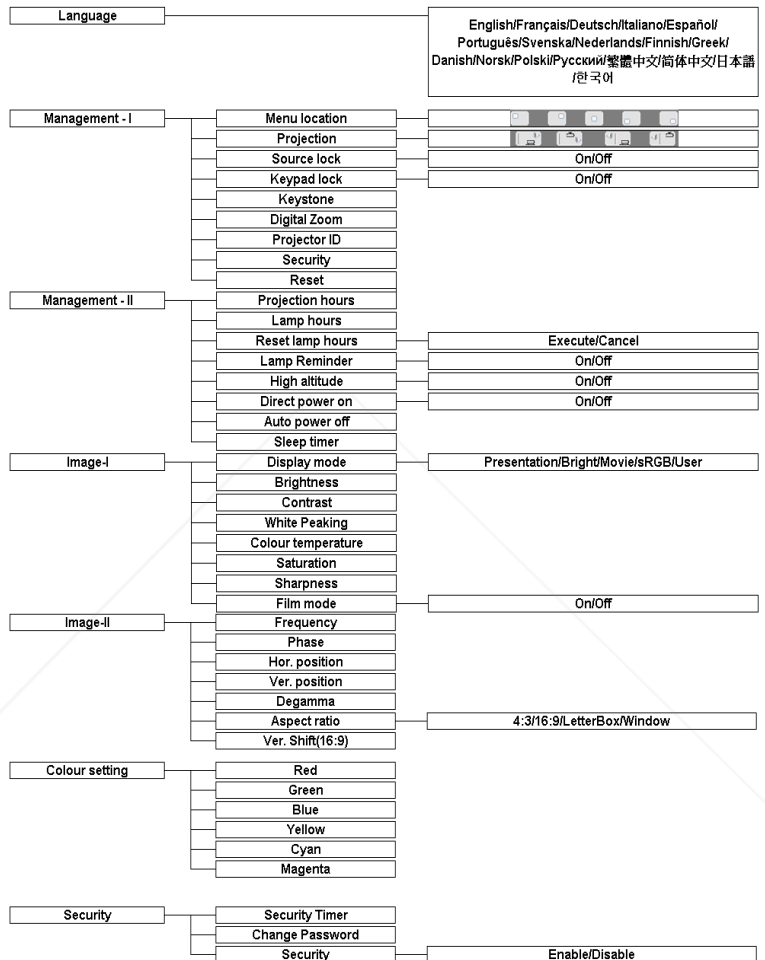

Management II

Projection hours

Displays the projection time.

Lamp hours

Displays the cumulative lamp operating time.

Reset lamp hours

Resets the lamp life hour counter after replacing the lamp.

Lamp Reminder

Choose this function to show or to hide the warning message when the changing lamp message is displayed. The message will appear 30 hours before end of life.

High altitude

Choose "On" to turn on High Altitude mode. Operates the fans at full speed continuously to allow for proper high altitude cooling of the projector.

Direct power on

Choose "On" to turn on Direct Power On mode. Operating the projector will automatically power on without pressing the "Power" key while AC power be inputed.

Color temperature

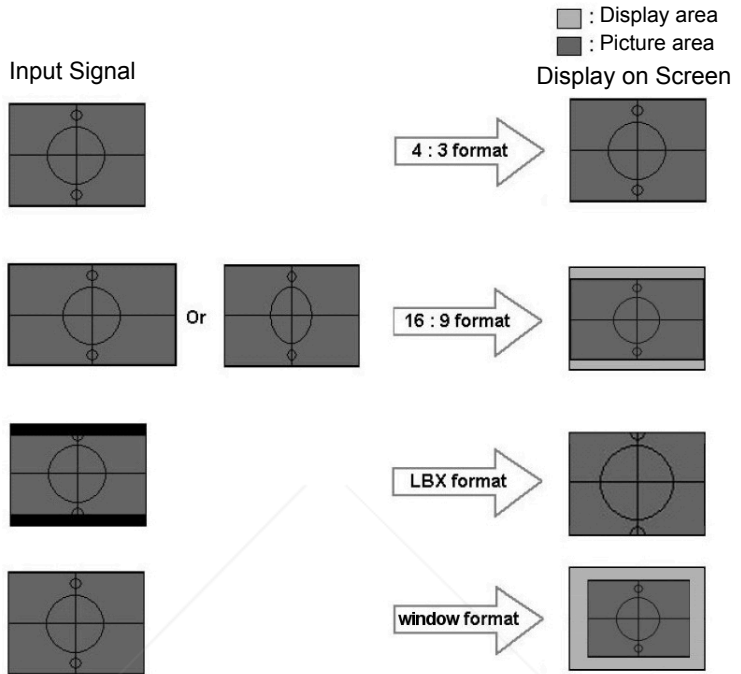

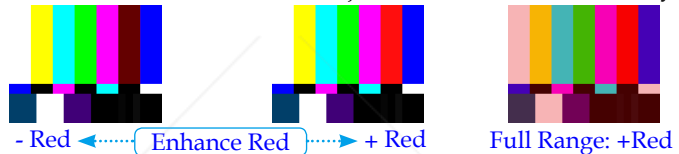

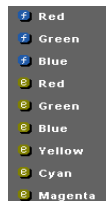

When you adjust the color setting item, the color temperature will be set as "User" automatically. And this set "User" is the same for all display mode.



Different color setting will be memorized at 4 different source groups. But they will be same under same source.

1. DVI / VGA
2. Component-p (480p/576p/720p/1080i)
3. Component-i (480i/576i)
4. Video / S-Video



When we adjust color setting the current color temperature will be memorized before it auto switch to "User". Because the memorized color temperature will be a base of "User". For example:

- 1.) Colour temp. is Low.



- 2.) User create his favorite color based on "Low" setting of colour temperature. So when user switch "Colour temp." to "User", will find the image color temperature close to "Low".



Troubleshooting

If you experience trouble with the projector, refer to the following information. If the problem persists, please contact your local reseller or service center.

Problem: No image appears on screen

- ▶ Ensure all the cables and power connections are correctly and securely connected as described in the “Installation” section.
- ▶ Ensure the pins of connectors are not crooked or broken.
- ▶ Check if the projection lamp has been securely installed. Please refer to the “Replacing the lamp” section.
- ▶ Make sure you have removed the lens cap and the projector is switched on.
- ▶ Ensure that the “Hide” feature is not turned on.

Problem: Partial, scrolling or incorrectly displayed image

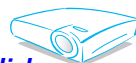
- ▶ Press “Re-Sync” on the remote control or control panel.
- ▶ If you are using a PC:
For Windows 3.x:
 1. In the Windows Program Manager, double click the “Windows Setup” icon in the Main group.
 2. Verify that your display resolution setting is less than or equal to 1280 x 1024.

For Windows 95, 98, 2000, XP:

1. Open the “My Computer” icon, the “Control Panel” folder, and then double click on the “Display” icon.
2. Select the “Settings” tab
3. Click on the “Advanced Properties” button.

If the projector is still not projecting the whole image, you will also need to change the monitor display you are using. Refer to the following steps.

4. Verify the resolution setting is less than or equal to 1280 x 1024 resolution.



5. Select the “Change” button under the “Monitor” tab .
 6. Click on “Show all devices.” Next, select “Standard monitor types” under the SP box; choose the resolution mode you need under the “Models” box.
- If you are using a Notebook:
1. First, follow the steps above to adjust resolution of the computer.
 2. Press the toggle output settings. Example: [Fn]+[F4]

- If you experience difficulty changing resolutions or your monitor freezes, restart all equipment including the projector.

Problem: The screen of the Notebook or PowerBook computer is not displaying a presentation

- If you are using a Notebook PC:

Some Notebook PCs may deactivate their own screens when a second display device is in use. Each has a different way to be reactivated. Refer to your computer’s documentation for detailed information.

Problem: Image is unstable or flickering

- Use “Phase” to correct it.
- Change the monitor color setting from your computer.

Problem: Image has vertical flickering bar

- Use “Frequency” to make an adjustment.
- Check and reconfigure the display mode of your graphic card to make it compatible with the product.

Problem: Image is out of focus

- Adjusts the Focus Ring on the projector lens.



Appendices

- ▶ Make sure the projection screen is between the required distance 4.9 to 39.4 feet (1.5 to 12.0 meters) from the projector. See page 16.

Problem: The image is stretched when displaying 16:9 DVD

The projector automatically detects 16:9 DVD and adjusts the aspect ratio by digitizing to full screen with 4:3 default setting.

If the image is still stretched, you will also need to adjust the aspect ratio by referring to the following:

- ▶ Please select 4:3 aspect ratio type on your DVD player if you are playing a 16:9 DVD.
- ▶ If you can't select 4:3 aspect ratio type on your DVD player, please select 4:3 aspect ratio in the on screen menu.

Problem: Image is reversed

- ▶ Select "Management → Projection" from the OSD and adjust the projection direction.

Problem: Lamp burns out or makes a popping sound

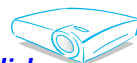
- ▶ When the lamp reaches its end of life, it will burn out and may make a loud popping sound. If this happens, the projector will not turn on until the lamp module has been replaced. To replace the lamp, follow the procedures in the "Replacing the Lamp".

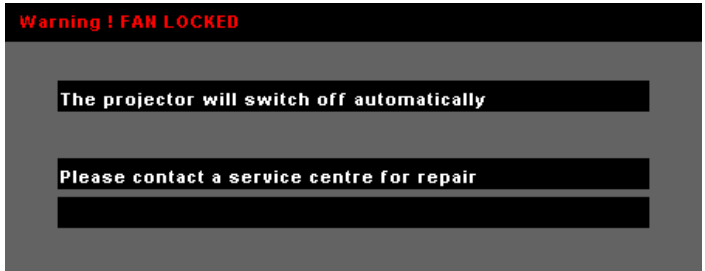

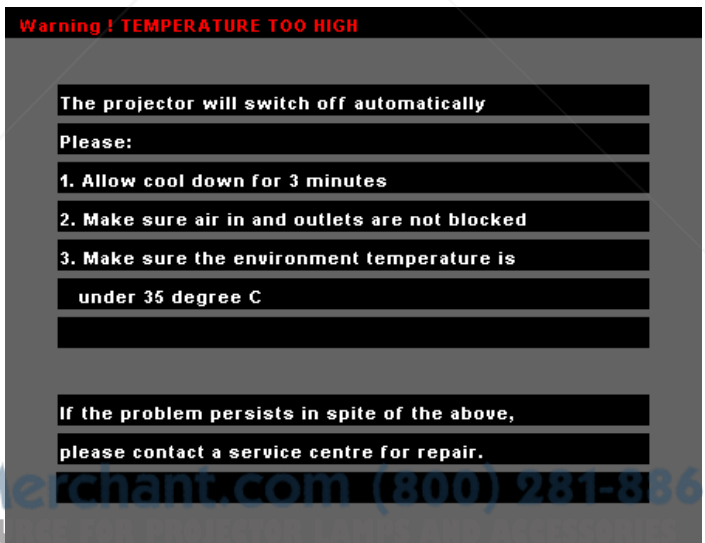

Replacing the lamp

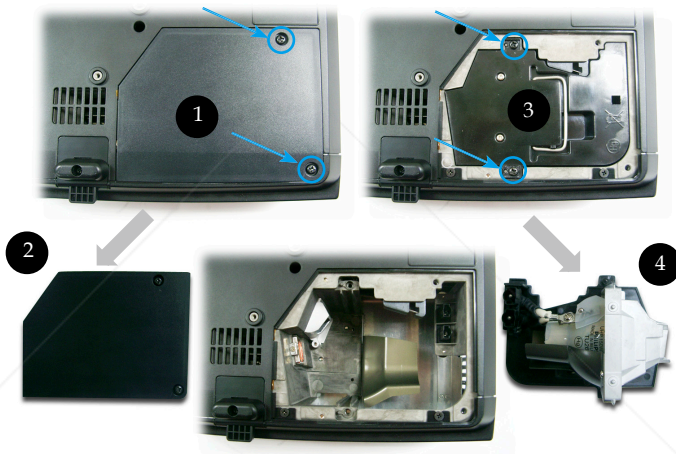
The projector will detect the lamp life itself. It will show you a warning message

! Lamp life exceeded. When you see this message, change the lamp as soon as possible.

Make sure the projector has been cooled down for at least 30 minutes before changing the lamp.



Warning: Lamp compartment is hot! Allow it to cool down before changing lamp!



Warning: To reduce the risk of personal injury, do not touch the lamp module or touch the lamp bulb. The bulb may shatter and cause injury if it is dropped.

Lamp Replacing Procedure:

1. Turn off the power to the projector by pressing the Power/ Standby button.
2. Allow the projector to cool down at least 30 minutes.
3. Disconnect the power cord.
4. Use a screwdriver to remove the screw from the cover. ①
5. Push up and remove the cover. ②
6. Remove the 2 screws from the lamp module. ③
7. Pull out the lamp module. ④

To replace the lamp module, reverse the previous steps.

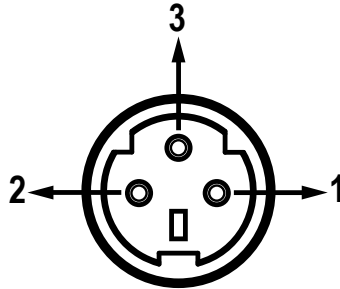


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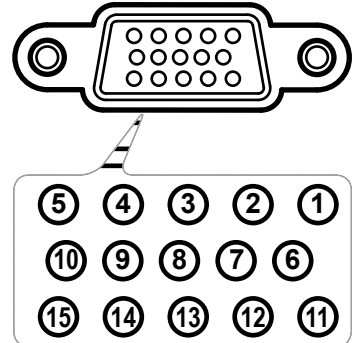

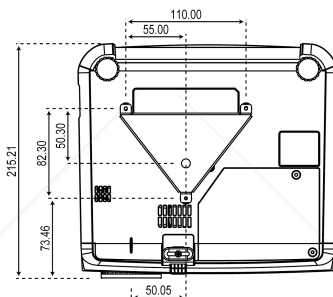
Ceiling Mount Installation

down automatically.

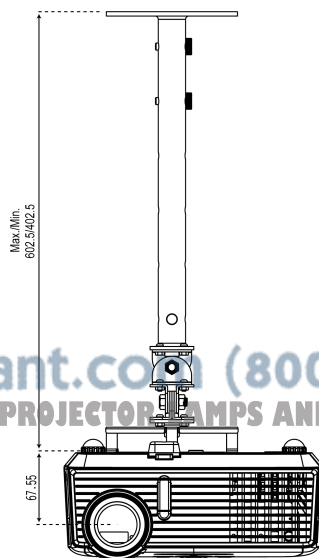


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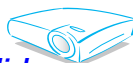
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
