Powering Off the Projector

1. Press the "Power/Standby" button to turn off the projector lamp, you will see a message

"	Power off the lamp ?	Picture Mute	" displayed on the

projector's screen. Press the "Power/Standby" button again to confirm, otherwise the message will disappear after 5 seconds.
