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

Introduction

Your new projector XP50 possesses a whole range of useful features and functions, e.g.:

- DLP technology (Digital Light Processing)
- minimal space requirements thanks to small housing
- easy to transport thanks to its low weight
- quiet operation
- high degree of brightness and good contrast
- Automatic Room Light Sensing ARLS
- high resolution (1024x768); other resolutions (640x480 through 1280x1024) are converted to 1024x768
- presentation of up to 16.7 million colours (in conjunction with an appropriate graphics card)
- automatic scanning of all horizontal frequencies from 15 kHz to 100 kHz and all refresh rates (vertical frequencies) from 43,5 Hz to 120 Hz (all absolutely flicker-free)
- freely adjustable colour alignment for matching the screen colours to the colours of various input and output devices
- convenient operation via integrated OSD (On-Screen-Display) menu
- Ability to control the computer from the projector's remote control (requires USB port on the computer)
- VESA-DDC compatibility
- plug&play capability
- power management for reducing power consumption when the connected computer is not in use

This Operating Manual contains important information you require to start up and run your projector.

A graphics card (screen controller) with VGA or DVI interface is required to control the projector. The projector processes the data supplied to it by the graphics card. The screen controller/the associated driver software is responsible for setting the modes (resolution and refresh rate).

In connection with the (optional) video module, the projector can also be used with a video camera or a compatible signal source.

When you operate the computer with an analogue signal source for the first time, you should adjust the projected image for the video card and set it to your requirements (see section "Settings using the OSD menu").

Target group

You don't need to be an "expert" to perform the operations described here. Do, however, read the chapter "Important notes" in the Operating Manual of the computer and in this Operating Manual.

Further information

Details of how you set the resolution and refresh rate are provided in the documentation on your screen controller/the associated driver software.

Important notes



Here you will find essential safety information regarding your projector.

Safety

This device complies with the relevant safety regulations for data processing equipment, including electronic office machines for use in an office environment. If you have any questions, contact your sales outlet or our customer service centre.

- Before you operate the project for the first time, read this Operating Manual carefully.
- Never open the unit. The projector contains no user-replaceable parts. Any repairs should only be performed by a qualified repair shop.
- If the device is brought into the installation site from a cold environment, condensation can
 form. Before operating the device, wait until it is absolutely dry and has reached approximately
 the same temperature as the installation site.
- During installation and before operating the device, observe the instructions on environmental conditions in the chapter "Technical data".
- To keep the projector from overheating, never cover it while it is running. Keep all air openings clear. Do not place the projector on heat-sensitive material.
- Do not operate the projector near any heat sources.
- The projector automatically sets itself to the correct voltage within the range from 100 V to 240 V. Ensure that the local mains voltage lies within these limits.
- Ensure that the power socket on the projector or the grounded mains outlet is freely accessible.

- The ON/OFF switch does not disconnect the device from the mains voltage. To completely disconnect the mains voltage, remove the power plug from the socket.
- If you do not use the projector for a longer period of time, shut off the power source completely (for example, by switching off a power bar) or disconnect the power cable from the projector.
- Use only the included power cable or a cable that is approved for your country.
- Lay all cables so that nobody can stand on them or trip over them. When attaching the device, observe the relevant notes in the chapter "Remote control".
- No data transmission cable should be connected or disconnected during a thunderstorm.
- Make sure that no objects (e.g. jewellery chains, paper clips, etc.) or liquids get inside the device (danger of electric shock, short circuit).
- If you notice an unusual smell, see smoke, and in emergencies (e.g. damaged casing, components or cables, penetration of liquids or foreign matter), switch the unit off, disconnect the power plug and contact your sales outlet or our customer service centre.
- Only qualified technicians should repair the device. Unauthorised opening and incorrect repair
 may greatly endanger the user (electric shock, fire risk).
- Do not replace the projector lamp yourself! If it is handled incorrectly, the projector lamp can explode.
- Do not look into the lens while the projector is running.
- Never look into the remote control's laser pointer beam.
- Never point the laser pointer at living beings, especially not at their eyes.
- To avoid injuries, always place the projector on a solid surface and use only the approved cover mount.
- You may set only those resolutions and refresh rates specified in the "Technical data" chapter.
- Allow the projector to cool down before you pack it up or transport it.
- Keep this operating manual together with your device. If you pass on the device to third parties, you should include this manual.

Cleaning notes

- Always pull out the power plug before you clean the projector.
- Do not clean any interior parts yourself, leave this job to a service technician.
- Do not use any cleaning agents that contain abrasives or may corrode colours.
- Ensure that no liquid will run into the system.
- Regularly clean the projector's air vents to maintain sufficient cooling air flow.
- The surface of the lens is sensitive to pressure and scratches. Clean it only using a soft, slightly moistened cloth.

Wipe the projector housing with a dry cloth. If the monitor is particularly dirty, use a cloth which has been moistened in mild domestic detergent and then carefully wrung out.



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- Allow the projector to cool down before you pack it up or transport it.
- Transport the projector with care and only in its original packaging or another corresponding packaging fit to protect it against knocks and jolts.
- Above all, never drop the projector.

Manufacturer's notes

Energy Star



The Fujitsu Siemens projector XP50 is designed to conserve electricity by dropping to less than 9 W when it goes into standby, suspend and OFF mode. With this new power management the XP50 qualifies for the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Energy Star Computers award.

The EPA estimates that computer equipment uses 5% percent of all business electricity and that this is growing rapidly. If all desktop computers and peripherals enter a low-power mode when not in use, the overall savings in electricity could amount to \$ 2 thousand million annually. 


Preparing for use



Pay attention to the relevant safety notes provided in chapter "Important notes".

Unpacking and checking the delivery

- ► Check whether the delivery agrees with the details in the delivery note.
- ► Unpack all the individual parts.
- ► Check the delivery for damage incurred during transportation.
- ▶ Make sure that the following components are included.



- 1 = Projector
- 2 = Video adapter
- 3 = Remote control with batteries
- 4 = Carrying case
- 5 = SCART adapter
- 6 = Operating Manual




Should you discover that the delivery does not correspond to the delivery note, notify your local sales outlet immediately.



It is recommended not to throw away the original packing material. Keep it for future transportation.

Remote control

Inserting batteries



- Open the back cover of the remote control by sliding it in the direction of the arrow (1).
- Place the batteries supplied in the battery compartment (2). Ensure correct polarity.
- Close the battery compartment by sliding the cover back on in the direction of the arrow (3) until you hear and feel it click into place.












Switching the remote control on and off



Turn the remote control on by moving the sliding switch on its right side toward the front the remote control.

When the LED lights up shortly, the remote control is operational.

When you press a function button on the remote control or move the mouse ball, the LED blinks.

Press the Laser button to activate the integrated laser pointer.



Never point the laser pointer at living beings, especially not at their eyes.

▶ If you will not use the remote control for a longer period of time, turn it off to conserve the batteries. Slide the switch on the right side of the remote control down.

Replacing batteries

 When the batteries are used up (LED no longer lights up), replace them with two batteries of the same type (LR03-AAA, 1.5 V).

Do not throw lithium batteries into the household waste. They must be disposed of in accordance with local regulations concerning special waste.









Setting up the projector

We recommend that you place your projector on a surface with good anti-slip qualities. In view of the multitude of different finishes and varnishes used on furniture, it is possible that the rubber feet of the projector as well as the high temperatures at the bottom of the projector will mark the surface the projector stands on.


The projector can also be mounted underneath the ceiling. The projector has a mounting socket on its bottom for this purpose. For suitable ceiling mounts, check with your dealer.

Connecting the projector to a computer

Information on the computer connections and interfaces is contained in the operating manual for your computer.



Please note the information provided in the "Safety" section in the chapter "Important notes" at the beginning of this manual.



1 = USB port

- ▶ Be sure that the projector and the computer are switched off.



The computer power plug must be pulled!










Connecting the data cable

 Use the data cable from the accessories that matches your computer's monitor port (VGA or DVI).

Connect the appropriate connector of the data cable to the active monitor port on the computer and secure the plug-in connection by tightening the safety screws.



► Connect the other end of the cable to the DVI connector (2) at the back of the projector.

Connecting the USB cable

The projector has a USB output (1). If your computer has a USB port and a driver for a USB mouse is loaded, you can control the computer with the projector's remote control as with a mouse. Proceed as follows:

- Insert the USB cable's connector into the USB port on the computer (consult your computer's manual).
- ▶ Insert the other end of the USB cable into the USB port (1) at the back of the projector.

Connecting the projector to the video adapter

You can use the projector to project video images, for example, from a video recorder or a camcorder. To do this, you must use the video adapter included.











Connecting the video adapter to the projector



- 1 = Slots
- 2 = Video adapter hooks

- 3 = Release button
- 4 = Connectors
- ▶ Insert the hooks of the video adapter (2) into the slots (1) of the projector.
- ► Press the release button (3) and swing the video adapter towards the projector. Make sure that the connectors (4) align correctly.
- ► Let go of the release button (3) and make sure that the video adapter is firmly connected to the projector.
- To remove the video adapter from the projector, press the release button (3) and swing the video adapter away from the projector.

Connecting devices to the video adapter



You can use the video adapter's "Computer" and "USB Mouse" connectors just like the same FIXYOUTDLP connectors on the projector (see "Connecting the data cable", "Connecting the USB cable").

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You can connect a camcorder or similar video device with the included accessory cable to the "Video", "Audio L" and "Audio R" sockets. With the SCART cable, you can connect other video sources, for example a video recorder.


You can also connect a matching video/audio source to the "S-Video", "Audio L" and "Audio R" sockets. The necessary S-Video cable is not included. With the loudspeaker integrated in the video adapter you can simultaneously listen to the right and the left signal (Audio R and Audio L, the total signal). The volume can be adjusted with the "Volume" buttons in the control panel of the projector or in the control panel of the remote control. The audio signal can only be heard when you have selected the "Video" signal source (see "Other settings").

You can connect a stereo output signal from your computer to the "Line in" connection with the cable provided in the accessories pack. With the loudspeaker integrated in the video adapter you can simultaneously listen to the right and the left signal (Audio R and Audio L, the total signal). The volume can be adjusted with the "Volume" buttons in the control panel of the projector or in the control panel of the remote control. The audio signal can only be heard when you have selected the "Computer" signal source (see "Other settings").

You can connect an external stereo audio amplifier to the "Line out" connection. The necessary audio cable is not included. When you connect a plug to the "Line out" output, the internal loudspeaker of the video adapter is switched off. Depending on the signal source (see "Other settings"), the audio signal of the computer or of the video source is output. The volume can be adjusted with the "Volume" buttons in the control panel of the projector or in the control panel of the remote control.

Check the respective device manuals for additional information.

Connecting the projector to the mains voltage



- 1 = Power connector
- Firmly insert the socket with the power cable supplied into the power connector (1) on the side of the projector and check whether the socket is securely connected.
- Connect the plug on the power cable supplied into a properly grounded mains outlet.
- If necessary, plug the power connector of the connected device into a properly grounded mains












Operating the projector



1 = Power indicator

- 3 = Control panel of the remote control
- 2 = Control panel of the projector
 - i If the projector has power, the power indicator (1) glows orange.

Switching the projector on and off

Always turn the system units on in the following order.

- Switch the projector on.
- Switch the computer on.
- Turn the projector on with the power switch on the projector's operating panel (2) or on the remote control (3). To turn the projector on from the remote control, the remote control must be on (see "Switching the remote control on and off").

The projector can be turned on only when it is in standby mode.



Even when the projector is turned off, it is still connected to the power. Remove the plug from the mains outlet so that the system is totally disconnected from the mains voltage. Remove the power plug only when the power indicated glows orange!

Notes on power management



If your computer is equipped with power management, the projector supports this function. The projector is equipped with a two-level power management, which you can activate with the OSD menu (see "Settings using the OSD menu").

If your computer during a longer period detects no input (inactivity) or if the projector cannot find a signal source, it switches to power-saving mode. Refer to the following table for further information. For detailed information on how energy-saving mode operates refer to the Operating Manual or Technical Manual of your computer.



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

If the energy-saving mode of the projector is not activated (DPMS enable deactivated), the projector is still switched on, even if there is no signal, the present logo is displayed.

When the projector is switched to the energy-saving mode by the power management system a power consumption of up to 9 W is maintained to feed the circuit for reswitching on the projector

To completely switch off the power consumption, pull the plug of the projector power cable out of the mains outlet. Remove the power plug only when the power indicated glows orange!



Even when the projector is turned off, it is still connected to the power. Remove the plug from the mains outlet so that the system is totally disconnected from the mains voltage. Remove the power plug only when the power indicated glows orange!



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


Changing projector settings

Projector settings

Tilting the projector


With the projector foot (1) you can adjust the projector tilt within certain limits.



- ▶ Press the unlock button (2).
- Move the projector foot (1) into the desired position.
- Release the unlock button (2). The projector foot is locked in the current position.

Adjusting picture definition and picture size

With the lens you can adjust the picture definition and picture size within certain limits.



- Turn the focus ring (1) to adjust the picture sharpness.
- Turn the zoom ring (2) to adjust the picture

Correcting trapezoid distortion

With the ▲ and ▼ buttons you can correct for keystone distortion within certain limits. Keystoning occurs if the projector is not positioned at a right angle to the projection screen but projects from a higher or lower position. This function is also accessible via the OSD menu (see "Settings using the OSD menu").

▶ Press and hold the ▲ or ▼ button until the projected picture no longer looks distorted.









Other settings

If you operate the projector with the included video adapter, you can

 adjust the volume with the "Volume" button on the projector's operator panel or on the remote control

 switch between the signal sources with the "Source/Select" button on the projector's operator panel or with the "Computer" and "Video" buttons on the remote control

Settings using the OSD menu

You can use the buttons on the control panels of the projector and the remote control to set the functions via an integrated OSD menu (On-Screen-Display).



The OSD menu is available in eight languages (default setting: English). How to change the language for the OSD menu is described in the section "Language menu". Most of the examples show the English OSD menu.

Operating the OSD menu with the projector's OSD menu

Activating the OSD menu

Press the "Menu" button on the projector.

The basic menu is displayed.

Marking a function or submenu

Use the arrow buttons to move the cursor to the desired function or submenu.

Selecting a function or submenu

► Press the "Source/Select" button.

The submenu opens, or you can make the desired settings.

Setting a function

▶ Press the ◀ or ▶ buttons until the setting is correct.

If the function can only be activated or deactivated:

▶ Select the desired function and activate it by pressing the "Source/Select" button.

Saving setting and terminating OSD menu

▶ Press the "Menu" button on the projector.



If you do not make a selection for about 40 seconds, the OSD menu closes, and the set value is stored.

Returning to the previous menu

► Press the ◀ button.

Returning to the higher-level menu

► If you want to return to the higher-level menu, select the adjacent symbol and confirm your selection with the "Select" button.

▶ Select the desired function and activate it by pressing the "Select" button.

If you do not make a selection for about 40 seconds, the OSD menu closes, and the set value is stored.

Returning to the previous menu

Roll the ball to the left.

Returning to the higher-level menu

If you want to return to the higher-level menu, select the adjacent symbol and confirm your selection with the "Select" button.



Basic menu

When you press the "Menu" button on the projector or the remote control, the basic menu appears.



With the basic menu, you can set contrast, brightness, colour and keystoning or switch to the setup menu.

You can adjust the brightness in the range from 0 to 100.





You can adjust the colour intensity of video images in the range from 0 to 100.

You can adjust the keystone correction in the range from -63 to +64.






From the setup menu you can select various submenus (Picture, System, Language, Effect, Service, User Logo).

Picture menu






From the Picture menu you can set the picture's screen aspect, colour temperature, sharpness, application type, ARLS (Automatic Room Light Sensing), tuning, width, position, and colour tint.

Screen Aspect

You can select between 16:9 (wide-screen format) and 4:3 (computer, conventional TV).



Colour temperature

You can select between four colour temperatures. As the colour temperature increases, the picture changes from yellowish to bluish.






Sharpness

You can adjust the subjective sharpness from "Very Sharp" to "Very Soft".





Application

You can adjust the display to the current application type:

- Normal operation (computer)
- Home theatre (video)
- Photographs (with Gamma correction)





ARLS (Automatic Room Light Sensing)

Automatically adapts the projector's brightness to the ambient light level. You can select between automatic adjustment, darker display, and brighter display.





Tune

You can set the phase length in the range from 0 to 100 and thus fine-tune analogue computer output if the automatic adjustment ("Reset" or basic settings in the basic menu) is unsatisfactory.

Width

You can set the horizontal frequency to optimise the picture width for analogue computer output if the automatic adjustment ("Reset" or basic settings in the basic menu) is unsatisfactory.



Position

You can adjust the picture position for analogue computer output if the automatic adjustment ("Reset" or basic settings in the basic menu) is unsatisfactory.





Tint

If you want to display video images in the NTSC format (American TV), you can adjust the tint in the range from 0 to 100. This setting has no effect on PAL or SECAM video images.

System menu





In the System menu you can adjust general operating settings.

Possible settings



Ceiling

If you mount the projector upside rotated 180° against the ceiling, this function turns the upside-down picture around again.



Rear

If you project the image from the back against a translucent surface, this setting flips the image horizontally.



SourceSearch

With this function, the projector automatically looks for a signal source (computer or video).

Hide OSD

If you activate this function, the menu functions are no longer displayed over the projected image (for example, when you adjust the volume or change the signal source). This function is useful if you have to adjust the volume during a presentation.



DPMS enable

This function activates the DPMS (Display Power Management Signaling). When the projector receives a corresponding signal from the computer, it switches to power-saving mode (< 9 W).

Language menu





On the Language menu you can select the language for the OSD menu.

Effect menu





In the Effect menu, you can assign one of the displayed functions to the "Effect" button on the remote control. You can select only one of these functions at a time.

Possible settings



Magnify

The picture is magnified until you press the "Effect" button again.

Set the magnification factor by rolling the mouse ball forward.



Freeze

Freezes and displays the current picture until you press "Effect" again.



Mask


