Operating a computer using the remote control

A computer can be operated using the projector's remote control. This function is available on any computer with the Windows 98/98SE, Windows Me, Windows 2000, Windows XP or Windows Vista OS, that is equipped with a USB port which can support USB1.1 (The mouse remote control receiver is also supported on OS 9 or OS X for the Macintosh). However, please note that Toshiba does not guarantee the operation of all computers.

Connecting a computer

Connect the mouse remote control receiver (supplied) to a computer.



The remote control may fail to operate if the mouse remote control receiver is exposed to bright sunlight or fluorescent lighting.

In such a case, change position or direction of the mouse remote control receiver and retry.

Press the mouse control button in the direction you wish the mouse pointer to move. then press.





- · Some types of computer cannot be used or connected to this projector. Check for an RGB output terminal, supported signal p.88, etc.
- Turn off the power of both devices before connecting.

Connecting with computers



- The MONITOR OUT terminal outputs analog RGB signals or component video signals (Y/ PB/PR) from the COMPUTER 1 IN, COMPUTER 2 IN, or from the COMPUTER 3 IN terminal as selected with the **INPUT** button. If no input is selected, the MONITOR OUT terminal outputs the input signals last selected among the COMPUTER 1 IN, COMPUTER 2 IN. and the COMPUTER 3 IN terminals. (Digital RGB signals are not output.)
- A computer monitor usually cannot accept Y/PB/PR signals correctly.


Turning the power off

Press the ON/STANDBY button.

A message appears on the screen, confirming that you wish to shut off the power. This message will disappear after a moment. (This operation is no longer valid after the message disappears.)

Press the ON/STANDBY button again.

A beep sound is made (if the beep sound is set to [On]) and the screen turns off, but the internal cooling fan continues to operate for a short while. Then, the projector goes into standby mode.



During cooling, the LAMP indicator flashes. In this state, the power cannot be Α turned back on.

If you are in a hurry, there is no problem with unplugging the power cord or turning off the main power switch in this state.

After the LAMP indicator goes off, the FAN indicator keeps lighted and the В cooling fan continues to operate for a short while, in order to expel excess internal heat.



The speaker volume can be adjusted when an audio signal is being input.

Notes

- While a text entry screen (e.g., the Password entry screen) is displayed, the remote control's FOCUS and ZOOM buttons function as numeric keys, and therefore cannot be used to adjust the screen size or focus. In such a case, use the FOCUS and ZOOM buttons on the projector to make adjustment or retry after quitting the text entry screen.
- Note that lamp characteristics may rarely cause the brightness to fluctuate slightly.
- A lamp is consumable item. If used for extended periods, images will appear dark, and the lamp could burn out. This is characteristic of a lamp, and is not malfunction. (The lifetime of the lamp depends on conditions of use.)
- The DLP[®] chip is made using extremely advanced technology, but there may be black spots (pixels that do not light) or bright spots (pixels that are constantly lit) on the panel. Please note that these are not malfunctions.
- Although this projector supports a wide range of RGB signals **p.88**, any resolutions not supported by this projector (XGA) will be expanded or shrunk, which will affect image quality slightly. To view high-quality images, it is recommended that the computer's external output should be set to XGA resolution.
- With some models of computer having LCD displays or the like, displaying images simultaneously on the projector and the monitor's display may prevent the images from displaying properly. If this happens, turn off the computer's LCD display. For information on how to turn off the LCD display, see the owner's manual of your computer.
- If no signal is being input from the connected equipment or signal input is stopped while projecting, the "No signal" will appear.
- If a signal not supported by the projector is input, the "Unsupport signal" will appear.
- If an unavailable operation button is pressed, the \bigotimes icon will appear.

Easy setup

This function automatically adjusts the screen focus and corrects the keystone distortion (Auto focus and Auto keystone functions).

- Press the EASY SETUP button on the projector or on the remote control. The icon go will appear during processing.
- Before pressing the EASY SETUP button, be sure to set Auto focus and select the items to be adjusted by Auto adjustment p.44.
- With [Easy setup] in the Default setting menu set to [On], the screen focus is automatically adjusted and the keystone

distortion (vertical and horizontal) is corrected when the power is turned on. (Automatic keystone distortion correction and auto-setting are selected by factory setting.)

Notes

- · A message appears on the screen if the auto-adjustment fails.
- Auto focus and Auto keystone functions are effective for projecting size from 40" to 100" diagonal (projection distance: 1.17 m to 3 m) at maximum zoom and 40" to 66" diagonal (projection distance: 1.79 m to 3 m) at minimum zoom.

Precautions

- Depending on the room temperature and brightness as well as the projecting surface condition and material, the adjustment may not be properly made. When such a case arises, adjust the screen focus manually.
- Improper adjustment or correction may also occur if the AF sensor is obstructed or the window gets dirty. Remove the obstruction and clean the AF sensor window in such a case.

■ Using auto setting (Only for analog input from computer)

This function sets up the projector to the optimum state such as sampling phase, frequency, screen position, and clamp for each type of the input signal by using simple operations.

Press the remote control's AUTO SET button.

For computer input, the sicon will ar r during processing You can set as well by selecting [Aut ng] in the Image adjustment menu p.39.




This is transmission mode to communicate between wireless LAN equipment.

This mode is applicable, for example, to a presentation in the conference room, as it requires no other facilities. This function can only be used if the projector is in range of the computer's wireless signals.

Toshiba does not guarantee the converage of the radio wave in the form of figures. The converage varies depending on the performance of each wireless LAN equipment, existence of obstacles or other wireless LAN equipment used by nearby working groups, etc. The coverage is generally estimated on the assumption that wireless LAN equipment be used in an unobstructed office or conference room.

◆ Infrastructure communication mode



A mixed wireless and wired LAN can be created via access points. (Communication between wireless LAN devices is also allowed.) Connecting to the rest of the world via a wired LAN or the Internet generally requires a high level of security.



• [Easy Connect (USB)]

This feature allows users to easily connect the projector to a computer over wireless networks, without making **Network settings** via **Wireless Utility**.

• [Network settings]

<Mode>

Your projector is set to **Ad hoc** in the factory. Change the setting if you want to use the projector in **Infrastructure** mode.

<Channel>

Usually, you do not have to set this item. If a network group having the same **SSID** already exists in the projector's coverage, the channel is changed automatically to the channel of that network group.

- Note 1: If a set channel is in bad connections for wireless connection, try the other channels to avoid the effects of radio waves to select the one in possibly the best communication conditions.
- Note 2: To communicate in Ad hoc mode with a computer that cannot change the channel, start up the projector before the computer.

<SSID>

This is an ID code for connecting to specific individuals over a wireless LAN. This may also be called "**Network group**" or "**Network name**". Please read the following carefully.

Note 1: The **SSID** is set to **TDPJ** when shipped from the factory. If you leave this setting as it is, security may be compromised due to access by a third party using the "**Wireless Utility**" within the projector's possible communication area. Before using the projector, therefore, be sure to set **SSID** to a character string different from the default.

Note 2: When you use the Ad hoc communication mode, if there is a similar **SSID** network group (for example TDPJ, TDPJ1, TDPJ2, etc.) in the possible communication area, it is possible that your projector name will not be displayed in the **Wireless Utility** projector list column. If this is the case, set **SSID** to a completely different character string.

<Encryption>

If you set **DHCP** to **Use**, the IP address of the projector is assigned automatically by the DHCP server. If your network environment does not assign IP addresses automatically, set **DHCP** to **Not use**, then set the following items **IP address**, **Subnet mask** and **Gateway** manually.

<IP address>

When **DHCP** is set to **Not use**, consult with your network administrator for the settings below and set the **IP address** manually.

An IP address is a unique number assigned to a terminal. The format is a string of four dot-separated three-digit numbers. (Example: 111.112.xxx.xxx)

<Subnet mask>

A subnet mask is used to determine what subnet the IP address assigned to a terminal belongs to. (Example: 255.255.xxx.xxx)

<Gateway>

This value specifies the device, such as a router, to be used to access servers outside the network. It is identified by the IP address. (Example: 111.112.xxx.xxx)

• [Setting initialization]

This item resets the wireless LAN settings to their factory defaults.

• [Projector name]

This can be used to identify projectors when communicating with multiple projectors, or if there is a possibility that another person who is out of communication range will be using the same projector. It is recommended this is set to prevent wrong transmission.

[Interval]






Drag the Image Quality Settings slider to the left or right to set the image guality of the file after conversion. Lower values create smaller files, but lower the image quality. (It is not possible to restore the quality of an image after it has been lowered.)



About lamp

The product's light source is a mercury lamp that lights at increased internal pressure. Be sure to fully understand the following characteristics of the lamp and handle it with extreme care.

- The lamp may burst with a loud noise due to impact or deterioration, or fail to light at the expiration of its life.
- How long it takes before the lamp bursts or the life expires may vary greatly by lamp. Some may burst shortly after first use.
- · Burst is likely to happen if the lamp is used after the replacement period has elapsed.
- When the lamp bursts, the broken pieces of glass may get inside the product or be released outside from the openings for ventilation.
- When the lamp bursts, a slight amount of mercury gas enclosed in the lamp along with glass dust may be released from the openings for ventilation.

■ Immediately replace the lamp when a sign appears on the screen.

- When the replacement time approaches, a message will appear on the screen.
- The risk of burst will increase if the lamp is continuously used without being replaced.
- Frequently check the used hours and prepare spares when the replacement time approaches. (Refer to "Status display". p.48)

When the lamp is broken

- If glass components, including a lamp and a lens, should break, handle the broken pieces with care to avoid injury and contact your dealer for repair service.
- In the event of lamp burst, unplug the product from the wall outlet, leave and completely ventilate the room. Then, thoroughly clean the area around the projector and discard any edible items placed in that area.
- When the lamp bursts, consult a doctor if glass dust or mercury gas gets into your eyes or you breathe it.

Lamp replacement

A lamp is consumable supplies. If used for extended periods, images will appear dark, and the lamp could burn out. This is characteristic of a lamp, and is not malfunction. (The lifetime of the lamp depends on condition of use.) If this happens, replace it with a new one.

• If the projector is mounted on the ceiling, it is recommended to use your Toshiba dealership when the lamp has to be exchanged.

Uncovering the lamp while the projector is mounted on a ceiling may lead to a danger of damage from falling pieces of glass if the lamp is broken. Besides, working at high elevations can also be hazardous. Do not attempt to replace the lamp by yourself.

When replacing, always use lamp "TLPLW14" (sold separately).

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- If you have been using the projector, the lamp will be very hot, and may cause burn injuries.
 Wait for the lamp to cool (for longer than 1 hour) before replacing it.
- If the lamp should break, please handle with care to avoid injury due to broken pieces and contact your dealer for repair service.

- It is recommended that the lamp be replaced after 2,000 hours of use. When [Lamp time] reaches 2,000 hours, the G icon and a message will appear with a beep sound. (After 2,000 hours, they will appear when the power is on at the first time every 100 hours.) This display disappears when you press the D button.
- Attach the outer lamp cover correctly so that it is not loose. If it is not attached correctly, the projector may fail to be powered on or the lamp may fail to come on.
- Always replace the lamp with a new one.
- The lamp is made out of glass. Do not touch the glass surface with your bare hands, bang it, or scratch it. (Dirt, jolts, scratches and the like could break the lamp.)

Used Lamps

This projector's lamps contain trace amounts of environmentally harmful inorganic mercury. Be careful not to break used lamps, and dispose of them in accordance with local regulations.

Lens and main unit cleaning


• Request cleaning and maintenance of a ceiling-mounted unit from your projector dealership. Attempting to clean/replace the lamp at a high site by yourself may cause you to fall down, thus resulting in injury.

Lens cleaning

- Clean the lens with a commercially available blower and/or lens cleaner.
- The lens is easily scratched, so do not rub it with hard objects, or strike it.

Main unit cleaning

- Clean the main unit after unplugging the power cord.
- Wipe dirt off the main unit gently with a soft cloth.
- Do not wipe the main unit with a damp cloth. Doing so may allow water to get inside, resulting in an electric shock or failure.
- Do not use benzene, thinner and the like as they may deform or discolor the unit or damage the paint surface.
- When using a chemically treated cloth, follow the precautions included with the cloth.






