This projector provides many convenient features and functions. Operating the projector properly enables you to manage those features and maintain it in better condition for a considerable time.

Improper operation may result in not only shortening the product-life, but also malfunctions, fire hazard, or other accidents.



If the problem still persists, contact the sales dealer where you purchased the projector or the service center.



# **SAFETY PRECAUTIONS**

# WARNING: TO REDUCE THE RISK OF FIRE OR ELECTRIC SHOCK, DO NOT EXPOSE THIS APPLIANCE TO RAIN OR MOISTURE.

- This projector produces intense light from the projection lens. Do not stare directly into the lens as possible. Eye damage could result. Be especially careful that children do not stare directly into the beam.
- This projector should be set in the way indicated. If not, it may result in a fire hazard.
- Take appropriate space on the top, sides and rear of the projector cabinet for allowing air circulation and cooling the projector. Minimum distance should be taken. If the projector is to be built into a compartment or similarly enclosed, the minimum distances must be maintained. Do not cover the ventilation slot on the projector. Heat build-up can reduce the service life of your projector, and can also be dangerous.



- Do not put any flammable object or spray can near the projector, hot air is exhausted from the ventilation holes.
- Remote Control Unit, supplied to this projector, emits the laser beam as the laser pointer function from Laser Light Window while pressing LASER button (for 1 minute / LASER POINTER INDICATOR lights red to indicate laser emission). Do not look into Laser Light Window or shine the laser beam on yourself or other people. Eye damage may result.
- If the projector is not to be used for an extended time, unplug the projector from the power outlet.

# **SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS**

All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the product is operated.

Read all of the instructions given here and retain them for later use. Unplug this projector from AC power supply before cleaning. Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.

Follow all warnings and instructions marked on the projector.

For added protection to the projector during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet. This will prevent damage due to lightning and power line surges.

Do not expose this unit to rain or use near water... for example, in a wet basement, near a swimming pool, etc...

Do not use attachments not recommended by the manufacturer as they may cause hazards.

Do not place this projector on an unstable cart, stand, or table. The projector may fall, causing serious injury to a child or adult, and serious damage to the projector. Use only with a cart or stand recommended by the manufacturer, or sold with the projector. Wall or shelf mounting should follow the manufacturer's instructions, and should use a mounting kit approved by the manufacturers.

An appliance and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the appliance and cart combination to overturn.





# **CONNECTING AC POWER CORD**

This projector uses nominal input voltages of 100-120 V or 200-240 V AC. This projector automatically selects the correct input voltage. It is designed to work with single-phase power systems having a grounded neutral conductor. To reduce risk of electrical shock, do not plug into any other type of power system.

Consult your authorized dealer or service station if you are not sure of the type of power supply being in use.



# **CAUTION**

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
## **POSITIONING PROJECTOR**

The brightness in a room has a great influence on picture quality. It is recommended to limit ambient lighting in order to provide the best image.





### ADJUSTABLE FEET

Picture tilt and projection angle can be adjusted by rotating Adjustable Feet. Projection angle can be adjusted to about 16 degrees.

- Lift the front of a projector and pull Feet Lock Latches on both sides of the projector.
- Release Feet Lock Latches to lock Adjustable Feet and rotate Adjustable Feet to fine tune position and tilt.
- To retract Adjustable Feet, lift the front of the projector and pull and undo Feet Lock Latches.

Keystone distortion of a projected image can be adjusted by Menu Operation. (Refer to P20 and 35.)




## **MOUNTING LENS COVER**

When moving this projector or when it is not used for an extended period, replace Lens Cover.

Before replacing Lens Cover, be sure to turn the projector off and disconnect AC Power cord from an AC outlet.

- Secure Strap for Lens Cover through a hole of Lens Cover.
- 2 Turn the projector upside down and secure Strap for Lens Cover to a hole on the bottom of projector with a screw.


Use Carry Handle when moving a projector.

When moving a projector, replace Lens Cover and retract Adjustable Feet to prevent damage to the lens and cabinet. When a projector is not in use for an extended period, put it into the case (carrying bag) supplied with the projector.



# **CAUTION**

Carrying Bag (supplied) is intended for protection from dust and scratches on the surface of a cabinet, and it is not designed to protect an appliance from external forces. Do not transport a projector through a courier or transport services with this bag. The projector can be damaged. When handling a projector, do not drop, bump, subject it to strong forces or put other things on the cabinet.




# LASER POINTER FUNCTION

This Remote Control Unit emits a laser beam as a laser pointer function from Laser Light Window. When LASER button is pressed, the laser light goes on. And when LASER button is being pressed for more than 1 minute or LASER button is released, light goes off. LASER POINTER INDICATOR lights RED and the laser is emitted with RED light to indicate that the laser beam is being emitted.




# **TURNING ON / OFF PROJECTOR**

### TURNING ON PROJECTOR

- Complete peripheral connections (with Computer, VCR, etc.) before turning on projector. (Refer to "CONNECTING PROJECTOR" on page 11~13 for connecting the equipment.)
- Connect the projector's AC Power Cord into an AC outlet. LAMP Indicator lights red, and READY Indicator lights green.

NOTE: When "On start" function is ON, this projector is turned on automatically by connecting AC Power Cord to an AC outlet. (Refer to pages 35, 36.)

Press POWER ON-OFF button on Top Control or on Remote 3 Control Unit to ON. LAMP Indicator dims, and Cooling Fans start to operate. Preparation Display appears on a screen and the count-down starts. The signal from PC or Video source appears after 30 seconds.

### TURNING OFF PROJECTOR







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#### **Power management**

This function turns Projection Lamp off when this projector detects signal interruption and is not used for a certain period in order to reduce power consumption and maintain the Lamp-life. (This projector is shipped with this function ON.)

Power Management function operates to turn Projection Lamp off when the input signal is interrupted and any button is not pressed over 5 minutes. This function operates as follows;

- 1. When any input signal is interrupted, "No signal" and the counting down display appears (for 5 minutes).
- 2. After counting down for 5 minutes, Projection Lamp and READY Indicator are turned off. (Cooling Fans keep running.)
- 3. READY Indicator starts to flash after cooling down Projection Lamp about for 90 seconds (Power Management mode). In this Power Management mode, Projection Lamp is automatically turned on when the input signal is connected or projector is operated with any button on Top Control or on Remote Control Unit again.



#### On start

When this function is "On," the projector is automatically turned on just by connecting AC Power cord to a wall outlet.

Note; Be sure to turn the projector off properly (refer to the section "TURNING OFF PROJECTOR" on P19). If the projector is turned off in the wrong steps, On Start function does not operate properly.



#### Remote control

This projector has two different remote control codes; the factory-set normal code (Code 1) and the secondary code (Code 2). This switching function prevents remote control operation mixture (jam) when operating several projectors or video equipment together. When operating projector in "Code 2," both projector and Remote Control Unit must be switched to "Code 2."

#### To change the code of the Projector;

Set Remote control in the SETTING MENU to "Code 2."

#### To change the code of the Remote Control Unit:





#### LAMP REPLACE

When the life of the Projection Lamp of this projector draws to an end, the LAMP REPLACE indicator lights yellow. If this indicator lights yellow, replace the projection lamp with a new one promptly.

This indicator lights yellow when the life of the projection lamp draws to an end. Replace the Projection Lamp with a new one promptly.







Allow a projector to cool, for at least 45 minutes before you open Lamp Cover. The inside of a projector can become very hot.




For continued safety, replace with a lamp assembly of the same type.

Do not drop a lamp assembly or touch a glass bulb! The glass can shatter and may cause injury.

Follow these steps to replace the lamp assembly.

- Turn off the projector and disconnect the AC plug. Allow the projector to cool for at least 45 minutes.
- 2 To remove Lamp Cover, remove the screw with a screwdriver.
- 2 Loosen 3 screws with a screwdriver and pull out Lamp Assembly by grasping Handle.
- 4 Replace Lamp Assembly with a new one and tighten 3 screws back into position. Make sure that Lamp Assembly is set properly. Replace Lamp Cover and tighten the screw.
- 5 Connect AC Power Cord to the projector and turn on the projector.
- **6** Reset the Lamp Replace Counter. Refer to "LAMP REPLACE COUNTER" on the next page.



#### LAMP REPLACE COUNTER

Be sure to reset the Lamp Replace Counter after the Lamp Assembly is replaced. When the Lamp Replace Counter is reset, the LAMP REPLACE Indicator stops lighting.

- Turn projector on, press MENU button and ON-SCREEN MENU will appear. Press POINT LEFT/RIGHT button(s) to move a red frame pointer to SETTING Menu icon (refer to page 35, 36).
- Press POINT DOWN button to move a red frame pointer to "Lamp counter reset" and then press SET button. The message "Lamp replace counter reset?" is displayed. Move the pointer to [Yes] and then press SET button.
- Another confirmation dialog box appears and select [Yes] to reset Lamp Replace Counter.

NOTE: Do not reset the Lamp Replace Counter until after the Projection Lamp is replaced.



## LAMP HANDLING PRECAUTIONS

This projector uses a high-pressure lamp which must be handled carefully and properly. Improper handling may result in accidents, injury, or create a fire hazard.

- Lamp lifetime may differ from lamp to lamp and according to the environment of use. There is no guarantee of the same lifetime for each lamp. Some lamps may fail or terminate their lifetime in a shorter period of time than other similar lamps.
- If the projector indicates that the lamp should be replaced, i.e., if the LAMP REPLACE INDICATOR lights up, replace the lamp with a new one IMMEDIATELY after the projector has cooled down.
   (Follow carefully the instructions in the LAMP REPLACEMENT section of this manual.) Continuous use of the lamp with the LAMP REPLACE INDICATOR lighted may increase the risk of lamp explosion.
- A Lamp may explode as a result of vibration, shock or degradation as a result of hours of use as its lifetime draws to an end. Risk of explosion may differ according to the environment or conditions in which the projector and lamp are being used.

#### IF A LAMP EXPLODES, THE FOLLOWING SAFETY PRECAUTIONS SHOULD BE TAKEN.

If a lamp explodes, disconnect the projector's AC plug from the AC outlet immediately. Contact an authorized service station for a checkup of the unit and replacement of the lamp. Additionally, check carefully to ensure that there are no broken shards or pieces of glass around the projector or coming out from the cooling air circulation holes. Any broken shards found should be cleaned up carefully. No one should check the inside of the projector except those who are authorized trained technicians and who are familiar with projector service. Inappropriate attempts to service the unit by anyone, especially those who are not appropriately trained to do so, may result in an accident or injury caused by pieces of broken glass.



## **OPERATING WIRELESS MOUSE**

Remote Control Unit is not only able to operate this projector but also usable as a wireless mouse for most Personal Computers. POINT buttons and two CLICK buttons are used for wireless mouse operation.

This Wireless Mouse function is available only when PC mouse pointer is displayed on a projected screen. When ON-SCREEN MENU or any message / dialog box is displayed on the screen instead of PC mouse pointer, this Wireless Mouse function cannot be used.

#### **INSTALLATION**

To use Remote Control Unit as Wireless Mouse for a Personal Computer, installation of the mouse driver (not supplied) is required. Make sure that the mouse driver is properly installed in your computer and that the mouse port (or USB port) of your computer is activated.

- Connect the mouse port (or USB port) of your computer to Control Port (or USB connector) of this projector with Control Cable (or USB cable). (Refer to page 11, 12 for connection.)
- Turn the projector on first, and then turn on your computer. When the computer is switched on first, Wireless Mouse may not work properly.

Note: When your computer has no mouse port, connect Serial Port of your computer to Control Port of the projector with Control Cable for Serial Port (not supplied).

#### **OPERATING WIRELESS MOUSE**

When controlling a PC mouse pointer, operate Wireless Mouse with POINT button, SET button, and RIGHT CLICK button on Remote Control Unit.

#### **POINT** button

Used to move PC mouse pointer. The pointer is moved corresponding with the direction you are pressing.

#### SET (LEFT CLICK) button

This button has the same function as the left button in a PC mouse.

#### **RIGHT CLICK button**

This button has the same function as the right button in a PC mouse. This button is not available for controlling this projector.

POINT button (Move the pointer)

SET button (left button of the mouse) RIGHT CLICK button (right button of the mouse)



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## **MAINTENANCE**

#### WARNING TEMP. INDICATOR

WARNING TEMP. Indicator flashes red when an internal temperature of the projector exceeds the normal temperature. This Indicator stops flashing when the temperature of the projector returns to normal. When WARNING TEMP. Indicator continues to flash, check the items listed below.

- Ventilation Slots of the projector may be blocked. In such an event, reposition the projector so that Ventilation Slots are not obstructed.
- Air Filter may be clogged with dust particles. Clean Air Filter by following the section AIR FILTER CARE AND CLEANING below.
- If WARNING TEMP. Indicator remains on after performing the above checks, Cooling Fans or the Internal Circuits may 3 be malfunctioning. Contact service personnel from an authorized dealer or a service station.

#### AIR FILTER CARE AND CLEANING

Removable Air Filter prevents dust from accumulating on the surface of Projection Lens and Projection Mirror. Should Air Filter become clogged with dust particles, it will reduce Cooling Fans' effectiveness and may result in internal heat build up and adversely affect the life of the projector. Clean Air Filter following the steps below:


- Turn off the projector, and disconnect AC power cord from the AC outlet.
- Turn the projector upside down and remove Air Filter by pulling the latches upward.
- Clean Air Filter with a brush or wash out dust and particles. 3
- Replace Air Filter properly. Make sure that Air Filter is fully inserted.



#### **CAUTION**

Do not operate the projector with Air Filter removed. Dust may accumulate on LCD Panel and Projection Mirror, and may degrade picture quality.

Do not put small parts into Air Intake Vents. It may result in malfunction of the projector.



#### RECOMMENDATION

We recommend avoiding dusty/smoky environment when operating a projector. Usage in these environments may cause poor image quality.

When using under dusty or smoky conditions, dust may accumulate on the lens, liquid crystal panels, or optical elements inside the projector. This condition may degrade the quality of a projected image.

When the above symptoms are noticed, contact your authorized dealer or service station for proper cleaning.



Apply a non-abrasive camera lens cleaner to a soft, dry cleaning cloth. Avoid using an excessive amount of cleaner. Abrasive cleaners, solvents or other harsh chemicals might scratch a surface.

## **TROUBLESHOOTING**

Before calling your dealer or service center for assistance, check the matters below once again.

- 1. Make sure you have connected a projector to your computer or video equipment as described in the section "CONNECTING THE PROJECTOR" on pages 11 ~ 13.
- 2. Check cable connection. Verify that all computer, video, and power cord are properly connected.
- 3. Verify that all power is switched on.
- 4. If the projector still does not produce an image, re-start your computer.
- 5. If an image still does not appear, unplug the projector from your computer and check your computer monitor's display. The problem may be with your graphics controller rather than with the projector. (When you reconnect the projector, be sure to turn the computer and monitor off before you power up the projector. Power the equipment back on in order of: Projector and computer.)
- 6. If the problem still exists, check the following chart.





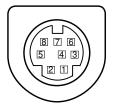
