#### TO THE OWNER

Before operating this projector, read this manual thoroughly to operate the projector properly.

This projector provides many convenient features and functions. Operating the projector properly enables you to manage those features and maintain it in better condition for a considerable time.

Improper operation may result in not only shortening the product-life, but also malfunctions, fire hazard, or other accidents.


If your projector seems to operate improperly, read this manual again, check operations and cable connections and try the solutions in the "TROUBLESHOOTING" section in the end at this manual. If the problem still persists, contact the sales dealer where you purchased the projector or the service center.



#### SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

## WARNING: TO REDUCE THE RISK OF FIRE OR ELECTRIC SHOCK, DO NOT EXPOSE THIS APPLIANCE TO RAIN OR MOISTURE.

- This projector produces an intensive light from the projection lens. Do not look directly into the lens; it may damage your eyes. Be especially careful that children do not look directly into the beam.
- This projector should be set in the way indicated. If not, it may result in fire hazard.
- Provide appropriate space on the top, sides and rear of the projector cabinet for allowing air circulation and cooling the projector. Minimum clearance must be maintained. If the projector is to be built into a compartment or similarly enclosed, the minimum distances must be maintained. Do not cover the ventilation slot on the projector. Heat build-up can reduce the service life of your projector, and can also be dangerous.



- Do not put any flammable objects or spray cans near the projector, hot air is exhausted from the ventilation holes.
- The Remote Control Unit, supplied with this projector, emits a laser beam as the laser pointer function from the Laser Light Window while pressing the LASER button (for 1 minute / LASER POINTER INDICATOR lights red to indicate laser emission). To reduce the risk of injury, do not look into the Laser Light Window nor shine the laser beam on yourself or other people.
- If the projector is not to be used for an extended period of time, unplug the projector from the AC outlet.

#### **SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS**

Follow all warnings and instructions marked on the projector.

For added protection to the projector during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet. This will prevent damage due to lightning and power line surges.

Do not expose this unit to rain or use near water... for example, in a wet basement, near a swimming pool, etc...

Do not use attachments not recommended by the manufacturer as they may cause hazards.

Do not place this projector on an unstable cart, stand, or table. The projector may fall, causing serious injury to a child or adult, and serious damage to the projector. Use only with a cart or stand recommended by the manufacturer, or sold with the projector. Wall or shelf mounting should follow the manufacturer's instructions, and should use a mounting kit approved by the manufacturers.

An appliance and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the appliance and cart combination to overturn.



#### FEATURES AND DESIGN

This Multimedia Projector is designed with the most advanced technology for portability, durability, and ease of use. It utilizes built-in multimedia features, a palette of 16.77 million colors, and matrix liquid crystal display (LCD) technology.

#### ♦ Wide Zoom Lens

This projector is equipped with a Wide Zoom Lens with a 1.5 times optical zoom, and provides a 100" screen size at a range of 10.4' (3.2m) to 15.6' (4.8m).

#### ◆ Compact Design

This projector is extremely compact in size and weight. It is designed to be carried and work anywhere.

#### ◆ Lamp Mode

The Lamp Mode function can be switched into the silent mode and reduce the brightness and set into the lower power consumption.

#### Compatibility

This projector accepts a wide range of video and computer input signals including;

#### Computers

IBM-compatible or Macintosh computer up to 1024 x 768 resolution.

#### 6 Color TV Systems

NTSC, PAL, SECAM, NTSC 4.43, PAL-M or PAL-N color system can be connected.

#### Component Video

Component video signal, such as a DVD player output high definition TV signals including 480i, 480p, 575i, 575p, 720p, 1035i or 1080i, can be connected.

#### S-Video

S-Video signal, such as a S-VHS VCR or camcorder, can be connected.

#### ◆ High Resolution Image

This projector provides 800 x 600 dots resolution for computer input and 500 horizontal TV lines. Resolution from a computer between SVGA (800 x 600) and XGA (1024 x 768) is compressed into 800 x 600 dots. This projector cannot display image of over 1024 x 768 dots. When the resolution of your computer is higher than 1024 x 768, reset it to a lower resolution.

#### ◆ Multi-Scan System

This projector has the Multi-Scan System to conform to almost all computer output signals quickly. Making manual adjustment of frequency and other settings is unnecessary.

#### ♦ One-Touch Auto PC Adjustment

Incoming computer video signals are recognized and the best adjustment is automatically set by Auto PC Adjustment.

#### ◆ Digital Zoom (for Computer)

The Digital Zoom function expands (to approx. 16 times of screen size in SVGA) or compresses the image size, allowing you to focus on crucial information at a presentation.

#### **♦ Keystone Correction**

Positioning height of the projector may result in distorted image being displayed in a trapezoid shape. Keystone Correction solves this problem by digitally altering projection to produce undistorted images.

#### ◆ Power Management

The Power Management function reduces the power consumption while the projector is not in use.

This Power Management function operates to turn the Projection Lamp off when a signal has not been received or a button is not pressed over 5 minutes. The Projection Lamp is automatically turned on again when the projector detects a signal or a button is pressed. This projector is shipped with this function ON.

#### ◆ Digital Visual Interface

This projector is equipped with DVI 29-pin terminal for connecting DVI output from a computer.

#### Switchable Interface Terminal

This projector provides a switchable Interface terminal. You can use the terminal as computer input or monitor output conveniently. (Refer to page 36.)

#### ◆ Laser Pointer Function

The Remote Control Unit supplied with this projector includes the Laser Pointer function. This function helps you to make a smart presentation on a projected screen.


#### **♦** Wireless Mouse

The Remote Control Unit supplied with this projector has the Wireless Mouse function for a connected computer. This function enables you to operate both the projector and the computer with the Remote Control Unit only.

#### **SETTING-UP THE PROJECTOR**

#### CONNECTING AC POWER CORD

This projector uses nominal input voltages of 100-120 V or 200-240 V AC. This projector automatically selects the correct input voltage. It is designed to work with single-phase power systems having a grounded neutral conductor. To reduce the risk of electric shock, do not plug into any other type of power system.

Consult your authorized dealer or service station if you are not sure of the type of power supply being supplied.


Connect the projector with all peripheral equipment before turning the projector on. (Refer to pages 11 ~ 13 for connection.)



#### **CAUTION**

For safety, unplug the AC Power Cord when the projector is not in use.

When this projector is connected to the AC outlet with the AC Power Cord, it is in Stand-by Mode and consumes a little electric power.




Connect the AC Power Cord (supplied) to the projector.

The AC outlet must be near this equipment and must be easily accessible.

#### NOTE ON THE POWER CORD

The AC Power Cord must meet the requirements of the country where you use the projector. Confirm the AC plug type with the chart below. The proper AC power cord must be used. If the supplied AC Power Cord does not match the AC outlet, contact your sales dealer.



#### INSTALLING THE PROJECTOR IN PROPER POSITION

Install the projector properly. Improper installation may reduce the lamp lifetime and cause fire hazard.



Do not tilt the projector more than 20 degrees above and below.

NO DOWNWARD

Do not point the projector down to project an image.

AND ACCESSORIES

Do not put the projector on either side to project an image.


#### POSITIONING THE PROJECTOR

- This projector is designed to project on a flat projection surface.
- The projector can be focused from 3.6'(1.1m) ~ 31.8'(9.7m).
- Refer to the figure below to adjust a screen size.

#### H1: H2 = 9:1

#### **ROOM LIGHT**

The brightness of a room has a great impact on picture quality. It is recommended to limit ambient lighting to provide the best image.



#### **ADJUSTABLE FEET**

Picture tilt and projection angle can be adjusted by rotating the Adjustable Feet. Projection angle can be adjusted to approx. 16 degrees.

- Lift the front of the projector and pull the Feet Lock Latches on both sides of the projector.
- Release the Feet Lock Latches to lock the Adjustable Feet and rotate the Adjustable Feet to fine tune the position and the tilt.
- To retract the Adjustable Feet, lift the front of the projector and pull the Feet Lock Latches and push to feet upward. Keystone distortion of a projected image can be adjusted by Menu Operation. (Refer to P20 and 36.)


Avoid positioning the projector with the angle of more than 20 degrees. The Projection Lamp may malfunction. Refer to page 8.

#### MOUNTING THE LENS COVER

When transporting the projector or when it is not in use for an extended period of time, attach the Lens Cover.

Before attaching the Lens Cover, be sure to turn the projector off and disconnect the AC Power cord from the AC outlet.

- **1** Secure the Strap for the Lens Cover through the hole.
- 2 Turn the projector upside down and secure the Strap for the Lens Cover to the bottom of the projector with a screw.



#### **MOVING THE PROJECTOR**

Use Carry Handle when moving the projector.

When moving the projector, attach the Lens Cover and retract the Adjustable Feet to prevent damage to the lens and cabinet. When the projector is not in use for an extended period of time, put it into the case (carrying bag) supplied with the projector.



#### **CAUTION**

Carrying Bag (supplied) is intended for protection from dust and scratches on the surface of a cabinet, and it is not designed to protect the projector from external forces. Do not transport the projector through a courier or transport services with this bag. The projector can be damaged. When handling the projector, do not drop, bump, subject it to strong forces or put other things on the cabinet.





#### **CAUTION IN CARRYING OR TRANSPORTING THE PROJECTOR**

- Do not drop or bump the projector, otherwise damage or malfunction may result.
- When carrying the projector, use a suitable carrying case.
- Do not transport the projector by using a courier or transport service in an unsuitable transport case. This may cause damage to the projector. To transport the projector through a courier or transport service, consult your dealer.



#### TERMINALS OF THE PROJECTOR

This projector has input and output terminals on its back for connecting computer and video equipment. Refer to figures on pages 11 to 13 for these connections.

#### S-VIDEO INPUT JACK

Connect the S-VIDEO output from your video equipment to this jack.

#### **VIDEO INPUT JACKS**

Connect the composite video output from your video equipment to VIDEO/Y jack or connect the component video outputs to VIDEO/Y, Pb/Cb and Pr/Cr jacks.

(Refer to P13.)

#### **AUDIO OUTPUT JACKS**

Connect an external audio amplifier to these jacks.

(Refer to P12, 13.)

#### **RESET BUTTON**

The projector uses a micro processor for control, and occasionally, need to be reset. This can be done by pressing the RESET button with a pen, which will shut down and restart the unit. Do not use the RESET function excessively.

#### CONTROL PORT CONNECTOR

When controlling your computer with the Remote Control Unit of this projector, connect the mouse port of your computer to this connector. (Refer to P12.)

## RGB INPUT 2 TERMINAL (DIGITAL/ANALOG)

Connect computer output (Digital / Analog DVI-I type) to this terminal. (Refer to P12.)

## RGB INPUT 1 / OUT TERMINAL (ANALOG)

This terminal is switchable and can be used as computer input or monitor output. Set the terminal up as either Computer input or Monitor output properly before using this terminal.

(Refer to P12, 36.)

Note:This terminal outputs analog signal from DVI-I RGB IN 2 terminal only.

## COMPUTER AUDIO INPUT JACK

Connect the audio output (stereo) from your computer to this jack. (Refer to P12.)


#### **OPERATION OF THE REMOTE CONTROL UNIT**




#### LASER POINTER FUNCTION

This Remote Control Unit emits a laser beam as the laser pointer function from the Laser Light Window. When the LASER button is pressed, the laser light goes on. And when the LASER button is being pressed for more than 1 minute or the LASER button is released, the light goes off. The LASER POINTER INDICATOR lights red and the laser is emitted with red light to indicate that the laser beam is being emitted.


The laser emitted is a class II laser; do not look into the Laser Light Window nor shine the laser beam on yourself or other people. The caution labels for the laser beam are shown below.






#### **Operating Range**

Point the Remote Control Unit toward the projector (Receiver Window) whenever pressing any button. Maximum operating range for the Remote Control Unit is about 16.4' (5m) and 60° in front and rear of the projector.



#### Power management

This function turns the Projection Lamp off when this projector detects a signal interruption and is not used for a certain period in order to reduce the power consumption and maintain the Lamp-life. (This projector is shipped with this function ON.)

The Power Management function operates to turn the Projection Lamp off when the input signal is interrupted and any button is not pressed over 5 minutes. This function operates as follows;

- 1. When any input signal is interrupted, "No signal" and the count down display appears (for 5 minutes).
- 2. After counting down for 5 minutes, the Projection Lamp and the READY Indicator are turned off. (Cooling Fans keep running.)
- 3. The READY Indicator starts to flash after cooling down the Projection Lamp about for 90 seconds (Power Management mode).

In this Power Management mode, the Projection Lamp is automatically turned on when the input signal is connected or the projector is operated with any button on the Top Control or on the Remote Control Unit again.

#### On start

When this function is "On," the projector is automatically turned on just by connecting the AC Power Cord to an AC outlet.

NOTE: Be sure to turn the projector off properly (refer to the section "TURNING OFF THE PROJECTOR" on P19). If the projector is turned off in the wrong steps, the On Start function does not operate properly.



#### Lamp mode

When selecting the " g " (Silent), the projector reduces the brightness and sets into the low power consumption mode.



#### Remote control

This projector has two different remote control codes; the factory-set normal code (Code 1) and the secondary code (Code 2). This switching function prevents remote control interference when operating several projectors or video equipment together.





Allow the projector to cool, for at least 45 minutes before you open the Lamp Cover. The inside of the projector can become very hot.




For continued safety, replace with a lamp assembly of the same type.

Do not drop the lamp assembly or touch the glass bulb! The glass can shatter and may cause injury.

Follow these steps to replace the lamp assembly.

- Turn off the projector and disconnect the AC plug. Allow the projector to cool for at least 45 minutes.
- To remove the Lamp Cover, remove the screw with a screwdriver.
- 3 Loosen 3 screws with a screwdriver and pull out the Lamp Assembly by grasping the Handle.




## LAMP HANDLING PRECAUTIONS

This projector uses a high-pressure lamp which must be handled carefully and properly. Improper handling may result in accidents, injury, or create fire hazard.

- Lamp lifetime may differ from lamp to lamp and according to the environment of use. There is no guarantee of the same lifetime for each lamp. Some lamps may fail or terminate their lifetime in a shorter period of time than other similar lamps.
- If the projector indicates that the lamp should be replaced, i.e., if the LAMP REPLACE INDICATOR lights up, replace the lamp with a new one IMMEDIATELY after the projector has cooled down.

  ( Follow carefully the instructions in the LAMP REPLACEMENT section of this manual. ) Continuous use of the lamp with the LAMP REPLACE INDICATOR lighted may increase the risk of lamp explosion.
- A Lamp may explode as a result of vibration, shock or degradation as a result of hours of use as its lifetime draws to an end. Risk of explosion may differ according to the environment or conditions in which the projector and lamp are being used.

#### IF A LAMP EXPLODES, THE FOLLOWING SAFETY PRECAUTIONS SHOULD BE TAKEN.



## **OPERATING WIRELESS MOUSE**

The Remote Control Unit is not only able to operate this projector but also usable as a wireless mouse for most Personal Computers. The POINT buttons and two CLICK buttons are used for wireless mouse operation.

This Wireless Mouse function is available only when PC mouse pointer is displayed on a projected screen. When the ON-SCREEN MENU or any message / dialog box is displayed on the screen instead of PC mouse pointer, this Wireless Mouse function cannot be used.

#### **INSTALLATION**

To use the Remote Control Unit as Wireless Mouse for a Personal Computer, installation of the mouse driver (not supplied) is required. Make sure that the mouse driver is properly installed in your computer and that the mouse port (or USB port) of your computer is activated.

- Connect the mouse port (or USB port) of your computer to Control Port (or USB connector) of this projector with the Control Cable (or USB cable). (Refer to page 11, 12 for connection.)
- Turn the projector on first, and then turn on your computer. When the computer is switched on first, Wireless Mouse may not work properly.

Note: When your computer has no mouse port, connect the Serial Port of your computer to the Control Port of the projector with the Control Cable for the Serial Port (not supplied).

#### **OPERATING WIRELESS MOUSE**

When controlling a PC mouse pointer, operate Wireless Mouse with the POINT button, SET button, and RIGHT CLICK button on the Remote Control Unit.

#### **POINT** button

Used to move PC mouse pointer. The pointer is moved corresponding with the direction you are pressing.

#### SET (LEFT CLICK) button

This button has the same function as the left button in a PC mouse.

#### **RIGHT CLICK button**

This button has the same function as the right button in a PC mouse. This button is not available for controlling this projector.

## **MAINTENANCE**

#### WARNING TEMP. INDICATOR

The WARNING TEMP. Indicator flashes red when an internal temperature of the projector exceeds the normal temperature. When the WARNING TEMP. Indicator continues to flash, check the items listed below.

- 1 The Ventilation Slots of the projector may be blocked. In such an event, reposition the projector so that the Ventilation Slots are not obstructed.
- 2 The Air Filter may be clogged with dust particles. Clean the Air Filter by following the section "AIR FILTER CARE AND CLEANING" below.
- 3 If the WARNING TEMP. Indicator remains on after performing the above checks, the Cooling Fans or the Internal Circuits may be malfunctioning. Contact service personnel from an authorized dealer or a service station.

#### AIR FILTER CARE AND CLEANING

The Removable Air Filter prevents dust from accumulating on the surface of the Projection Lens and the Projection Mirror. Should Air Filter become clogged with dust particles, it will reduce the Cooling Fans' effectiveness and may result in internal heat build up and adversely affect the life of the projector. Clean the Air Filter following the steps below:


- Turn off the projector, and disconnect the AC Power Cord from the AC outlet.
- Turn the projector upside down and remove the Air Filter by pulling the latches upward.
- ? Clean the Air Filter with a brush or wash out dust and particles.
- 4 Replace the Air Filter properly. Make sure the Air Filter is fully inserted.



#### **CAUTION**

Do not operate the projector with the Air Filter removed. Dust may accumulate on the LCD Panel and the Projection Mirror, and may degrade the picture quality.

Do not put small parts into the Air Intake Vents. It may result in malfunction of the projector.



#### **RECOMMENDATION**

We recommend avoiding dusty/smoky environment when operating the projector. Operating in these environments may cause poor image quality.

When using under dusty or smoky conditions, dust may accumulate on the lens, liquid crystal panels, or optical elements inside the projector. This condition may degrade the quality of a projected image.

When the above symptoms are noticed, contact your authorized dealer or service station for proper cleaning.

#### **CLEANING PROJECTION LENS**

Follow these steps to clean the Projection Lens:

- Apply a non-abrasive camera lens cleaner to a soft, dry cleaning cloth. Avoid using an excessive amount of cleaner. Abrasive cleaners, solvents or other harsh chemicals might scratch the lens.
- Lightly wipe a cleaning cloth over the Projection Lens

When the projector is not in use, attach the Lens Cover.



## **TROUBLESHOOTING**

Before calling your dealer or service center for assistance, check the following:

- Make sure you have connected the projector to peripheral equipment as described properly in the section "CONNECTING THE PROJECTOR" on pages 11 ~ 13.
- Verify that all computer, video and power cord are properly connected and turn the equipment on.
- When you are operating the projector with a computer and it does not produce an image, restart the computer.
- Select the other input source.


